Once Brian has advised the park of your vehicle registration number (please let him know that if you haven't already) you will receive a detailed email from the park advising how the express check-in works via the entrance at **4 Hamilton Road**, **Eaton** (not the Pratt Road entrance) and your site number. The camera at the gate will recognise your registration and automatically open the gate. After setting up you can then walk to the park office and pay your fees, or you may pay in advance as requested in the park email. **Please read their email fully as there is important information in it.**

The Christmas gift giving is optional. To participate each member will need to purchase a gift from Bunnings to the value of \$10. They can be male, female or unisex. I am sure you will find a good variety of goods in this price range to choose from at Bunnings.

The Christmas lunch on Saturday at 12.30 pm will be at the Back Beach Café in Bunbury. The cost of the two-course meal with tea and coffee will be \$35 per head. Members are required to pay \$20 per head (to be collected at Happy Hour on Friday) and the Club will subsidise the remaining \$15. There will be a choice between two mains and two desserts and an email will be sent out shortly asking for your choices.

RECIPE OF THE MONTH

Our secretary Di Young loves to bake and this is one of her favourite slice recipes. It is yummy. Enjo

DI'S ANZAC CARAMEL SLICE TOPPING

BASE

1 cup of SR flour
½ cup desiccated coconut
½ cup brown sugar
140gm unsalted butter melted

1 cup shredded coconut

1 cup rolled oats

½ cup golden syrup

80gm melted unsalted butter extra 1 x 380gm store bought caramel filling

BASE

- 1. Preheat oven to 180C. Line base and sides of 20cm x 30cm slice tin with non-stick baking paper.
- 2. Place flour, coconut, sugar and butter in a bowl and stir until mixture resembles coarse breadcrumbs.
- 3. Using the back of a spoon, press mixture into slice tin. Bake for 20 25 minutes until golden.
- 4. Allow to cool for 10 minutes.

TOPPING

- 1. Place shredded coconut, oats, golden syrup and extra melted butter in bowl and mix to combine.
- 2. Spread the caramel topping over the cooled base
- 3. Spoon over the oat topping
- 4. Bake a further 20 -25 minutes until golden.
- 5. Allow to cool completely before cutting into squares. Makes 20
