Di's Easy Cranberry Pistachio Cheese Log

Instructions

Ingredients

Cranberry Pistachio Coating

13 Alan Kírby

1 ¼ cups fresh cranberries 1 cup shelled roasted, salted pistachios

Cheese Log

7-8 oz. goat cheese log or tub
4 oz. cream cheese, softened
2 tablespoons honey
¹/₄ tsp EACH ground ginger, cinnamon, salt, dried thyme, dried rosemary
1/8 teaspoon pepper

- Add cranberries and pistachios to food processor and chop into small pieces. Remove ½ cup and add it to a medium bowl. Add all remaining Goat Cheese log ingredients to the bowl and stir to combine.
 Add this cheese mixture to a large piece of plastic wrap, and
- 2. Add this cheese mixture to a large piece of plastic wrap, and form into the shape of a log. Wrap in plastic wrap. Freeze for 20 mins. We want the log slightly firm so it holds its shape but is still soft enough for the coating to be pressed into.
- 3. Line counter with a large piece of parchment paper. Add coating ingredients to parchment and spread into a single layer square a little larger than the length of the cheese log. Add cheese log to the edge of the coating and roll in coating until evenly coated, pressing coating into the cheese so it sticks. The cheese log can be refrigerated at this point until ready to serve.
- 4. When ready to serve, remove from refrigerator 15 minutes beforehand so it can soften. Drizzle generously with honey just before serving. Serve with crackers

Helen's Magic Mixed Nuts

<u>Ingredients</u>

2 egg whites
4 cups of unsalted nuts, i.e. cashews, almonds, pecans and hazelnuts.
½ cup sugar
1 tsp cinnamon
1 tsp cayenne pepper
1/2 tsp salt

<u>Ingredient</u>

250gm soft butter 250gm plain flour 125gm icing sugar 125gm cornflour

Instructions

Preheat oven to 325 degs (160c). Place egg whites in a large bowl. Whisk just until foamy. Stir in nuts until coated. Combine sugar with cinnamon, cayenne and salt. Pour over nuts and toss until coated.

Spread evenly on greased cookie sheets and bake 20-25 mins, stirring frequently. Cool and store in sealed containers. They last a long time in a well-sealed container.

Maureen's Shortbread Biscuits

Instructions

Combine all ingredients. Mix well by hand. Roll into balls. Press down with fork. Bake in slow oven (135-140c) Makes quite a few.
