Watheroo Station tavern is situated 37 kms north of Moora along The Midlands Road. This fabulous rest area is situated amongst the trees and includes all amenities such as power, toilets and shower facilities. Enjoy the use of the BBQ area located directly opposite the sites or take a walk next door to the tavern to enjoy a delicious meal.

NOVEMBER 26th - 30th BROOKTON

The town of Brookton is approx. 100 kms from Perth. Brookton was settled by itinerant Sandalwood cutters in approximately 1847. By 1860's and 70's more settlers moved into the area and Sandlewood collecting with and wheat and sheep farming was firmly established. In 1889 the Railway station, one of the original Stations on the Great Southern Line was built. This is now the Arts & Craft Shop and worth a visit. The old Police Station is now the base of the local Historical society and also worth visiting.

Fees are \$29 per night BUT if you have a Pension or Seniors Card and we list names and numbers for the Shire, then Concession price is \$26 per night.

Our Christmas Meal is to be held in the Tavern on the sat. evening, in a private room, is \$35 per person with drinks at own cost.
